PRT Brighton - We have lift off



First crops at PRT Brighton

We are pleased to announce we now have a fully functioning containerized forest seedling nursery in Brighton, MI. The site will serve forestry customers and forest landowners in the Great Lakes States (GLS) Region of the United States. After months of construction, the first seeded blocks left the PRT Brighton sow line on March 18, 2019, and after a short, four wheel drive, mud bog trip on a mini truck, were delivered to one of the newly constructed greenhouses at PRT Brighton. This on-time event was thanks to the hard work, expertise and support from all levels within PRT. In particular, the on-site team at PRT Brighton (Chad Field, Chris Schenk and Nikita Brabbit) who have worked through the construction phase and are ready to take on day-to-day management.

PRT Brighton - continued...

PRT Brighton currently consists of approximately 53,000 blocks of greenhouse capacity (18 greenhouses) and 10,000 blocks of open compound facilities. The site utilizes Harnois Ovaltech ground-to-ground greenhouses controlled by Argus Environmental Controls. All crop production is supported by a large on-site production building that includes an irrigation/fertilizer injector room, large production space as well as offices, lunch/meeting room, tool room and restrooms.

Irrigation water is supplied by an on-site, 185 gallon per minute well, with back-up from a second smaller well and a storm water retention pond.



The environmental controls, irrigation, and production building are in-turn backed up by a diesel generator as part of our standard Risk Management procedures.

This nursery is located at the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' (MI DNR) State Forest Tree Improvement Center near Brighton MI. PRT signed a long term lease with the MI DNR. PRT intends to expand over time to meet increasing customer needs, including those of the MI DNR. This nursery will offer primarily Red Pine and Jack Pine as well as other species.

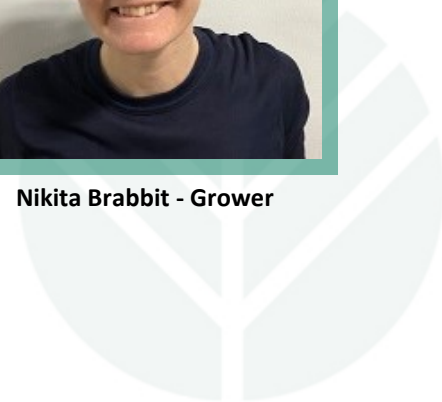

Bionera Resources Inc. - Update

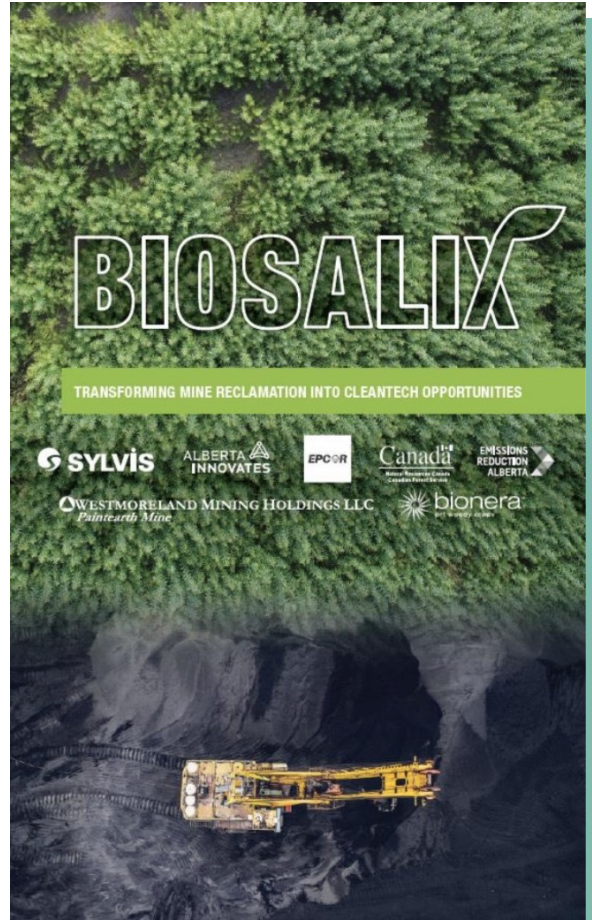
PRT's Bionera Resources division establishes and manages large scale woody biomass projects in Western Canada. Bionera specializes in establishing short rotation willow crops for biomass generation, which act as outlets for municipal wastewater or treated biosolids.

Bionera was formed as a wholly owned subsidiary of PRT in 2007, when PRT sought to diversify operations, and completed some in-house willow plantations at PRT nurseries (Red Rock, Campbell River, Beaverlodge, and Hubbard) from 2008-2010. From 2014-2017, through a partnership with newcomers Sylvis Environmental, Bionera completed a 400 ha (1,000 acre) willow plantation North of Strathmore, AB. The plantation uses biosolids from the City of Calgary. The Strathmore project is the largest contiguous willow plantation in North America and utilized approximately 6.7 million cuttings.

In late 2018 Bionera was successful in negotiating another large 3 year agreement with Sylvis Environmental.

This is the Biosalix mine reclamation (Westmoreland coal mine) and biomass project at Forestburg, AB. It is a 500 ha (1,200 acre) three year project. Year 1 of planting is commencing in June, 2019. This project will utilize biosolids from the City of Edmonton. Year 1 planting will continue throughout summer, 2019 and the project will utilize 7.2 million cuttings.

Bionera is ably run by Martin Labelle, General Manager, and Marty van der Heever, Operations Manager, both of whom are on site for the year 1 planting program from May to June. Martin has been involved with Bionera/PRT since 2015 and also doubles as PRT's Customer Support Representative for Coastal BC. Marty is a recent hire and comes to Bionera with extensive farming and agricultural experience from South Africa.



We look forward to the continuation of the Biosalix project in 2020 and 2021. We also look forward to expanding this exciting, cost effective, waste treatment option to new projects in the future.

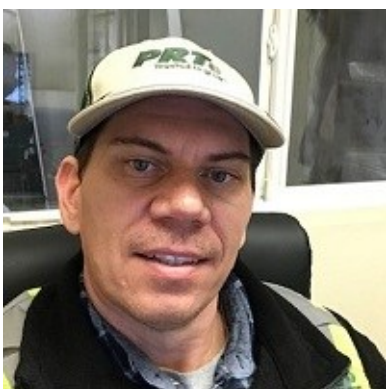
Resources Consultants, and as owner-operator of his own firm. It was at this time that he honed his sales and marketing skills, by providing value-added services to his clients.
